Professor Yong Zhao is a Foundation Distinguished Professor in the School of Education at the University of Kansas, USA. He previously served as the Presidential Chair and Director of the Institute for Global and Online Education in the College of Education, University of Oregon, where he was also a Professor in the Department of Educational Measurement, Policy, and Leadership. Prior to Oregon, Professor Zhao was University Distinguished Professor at the College of Education, Michigan State University, where he also served as the founding director of the Centre for Teaching and Technology, Executive Director of the Confucius Institute, as well as the US-China Centre for Research on Educational Excellence. Professor Zhao's works focus on the implications of globalisation and technology on education. He has published over 100 articles and 30 books, including *Counting What Counts: Reframing Education Outcomes (2016)*, Never Send a Human to Do a Machine's Job: Correcting Top 5 Ed Tech Mistakes (2015), Who's Afraid of the Big Bad Dragon: Why China has the Best (and Worst) Education System in the World (2014), Catching Up or Leading the Way: American Education in the Age of Globalisation (2009) and World Class Learners: Educating Creative and Entrepreneurial Students (2012).
